

## **The King's Academy Remembers Founder, Lincoln Westcott, Who Served on School Board for Over 20 Years**

In 1991, Lincoln Westcott, along with his wife Linda, was part of the original group of parents that founded The King's Academy. These parents shared a vision for a school based on biblical principles where students could thrive, both spiritually and academically, and where young men and women would be trained as leaders who would go out into the world and make a difference for Christ.

Lincoln was a member of the first TKA School Board and continued to dedicate his time and energy to serve on the board for over 20 years. He had the longest tenure of any school board member and, even after he retired from the board, he continued to serve as a real estate consultant when a special task force was created. Outside of

TKA, Lincoln was a commercial real estate developer, working with Pollock Financial Group, from 1976-1985 and 1993 to present.

The King's Academy has very much been a part of Lincoln's life since its founding. One of his best friends was another TKA founder, Paul Spates, for whom the school's gymnasium is named. Lincoln's daughter, Louanne, met her husband, Ed Gonzalez, at TKA while they both worked for the school. His son, Lance (one of TKA's first students, Class of 1996), married Mandy Davidson, a fellow classmate after both graduating from TKA. Over the past few years, Lincoln took great delight in watching several of his grandchildren become students at The King's Academy. Thankfully, he has many more grandchildren who will become students in the near future.

In addition to his dedication to TKA, Lincoln served as a Bible Study Fellowship (BSF) leader for over 10 years, and through his quiet, humble, and gentle spirit, shared the love of Jesus with those around him.

Surrounded by his family, Lincoln went home to his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ on Friday, October 13. His daughter, Louanne Westcott Gonzalez writes, *"We miss him tremendously, but we rejoice in the hope of a glorious reunion one day in heaven."*

Lincoln Westcott will always be remembered as a bright and steady light who loved the Lord and loved The King's Academy.
