ACADEMICS

The King's Academy offers a variety of academic curricula including 10 honors courses and 18 AP courses. With counselor assistance, students are encouraged to choose the curriculum that best suits their interests and goals. Teachers employ a variety of instructional strategies that promote active learning. With TKA's 1:1 technology program, students bring their own devices and use applications that enrich learning and engagement. Caring and passionate teachers create a positive and encouraging learning environment at all grade levels.

COLLEGE AND ACADEMIC COUNSELING

The King's Academy places a high value on counseling our students throughout the academic and college planning process. The College and Academic Counseling program begins in the freshman year and emphasizes a sound foundation for academic and extracurricular planning. Each 9th grade student is assigned a personal college counselor who remains with the student through the senior year. TKA's ratio of student to college counselor is 60:1, enabling a highly personalized college counseling experience. Our comprehensive program includes individualized counseling, informational presentations at each grade level, student workshops on essay writing and applications, and guest speakers on topics such as financial aid. State-of-the-art online tools are available for our students and families to navigate the college admissions process successfully. TKA counselors work closely with families to find colleges and universities that are best aligned with a student's academic and extracurricular interests, career aspirations, and financial aid requirements. The primary goal is to help students find the best "fit" institution, enabling them to apply their God-given gifts to pursue their goals with confidence and maturity.

SPIRITUAL LIFE AND COMMUNITY SERVICE

Although The King's Academy places high value on academic excellence, it differs from other schools in that everything at TKA is designed to bring students closer to God, create strong relationships between students and staff, and build Christian servant leaders. The entire student body has daily opportunities to mature spiritually through home groups, retreats, chapels, clubs, peer groups, mentoring, and service. Students become disciples of the Word. The annual TKA Service Week provides high school students with life-changing opportunities to serve those in need. In 2023, groups will partner with local organizations to serve in Anchorage (AK), Kentucky, Los Angeles, Navajo Nation (AZ), Portland (OR), Seattle (WA), Tulsa (OK), Tecate (Mexico) as well as in Dinuba, Lotus, Sunnyvale, and San Francisco (CA).

VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS

Well known throughout the Bay Area, The King's Academy's Visual and Performing Arts (VPA) Department seeks to honor God through developing students' creative gifts and offering an environment where they can share those gifts with the world. The VPA environment fosters creativity and confidence as students develop their musical, artistic, and dramatic skills. This department currently offers classes in a variety of art mediums, digital design, photography, video production, dance, theatre, vocal music, marching band, jazz band, and orchestra. The work of the students is displayed in exhibits, workshops, concerts, community events, and stage performances.

ATHLETICS

The King's Academy athletic program desires to "pursue victory with honor" and to compete with pride, hustle, desire and humility. The King's Academy is a member of the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF), the Central Coast Section (CCS), the West Bay Athletic League (WBAL), the Peninsula Athletic League (PAL-Football), and Santa Clara Valley Athletic League (SCVAL-boys volleyball). TKA aims to compete at the CCS championship level each year. Last year, 12 varsity teams qualified for CCS playoffs, and girls track and field were WBAL League Champions. The King's Academy offers junior varsity and varsity boys and girls basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field, and volleyball; boys baseball, football; and girls softball.

The interview provides an opportunity for all parties to become acquainted and to determine whether your child will be successful at The King's Academy. Together, we will review your child's application and discuss your family's goals for your child.

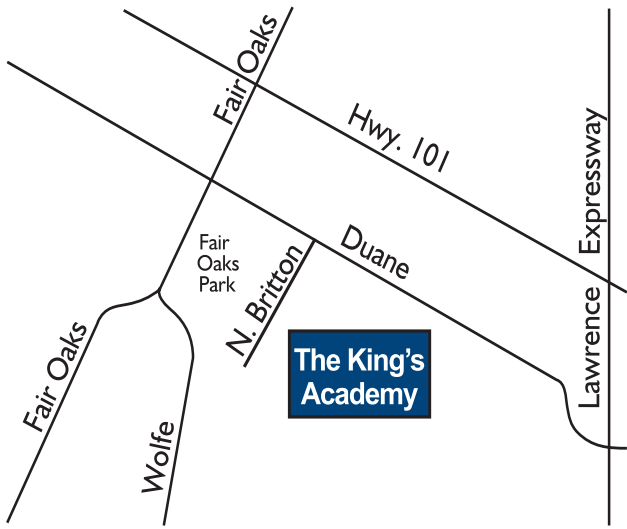

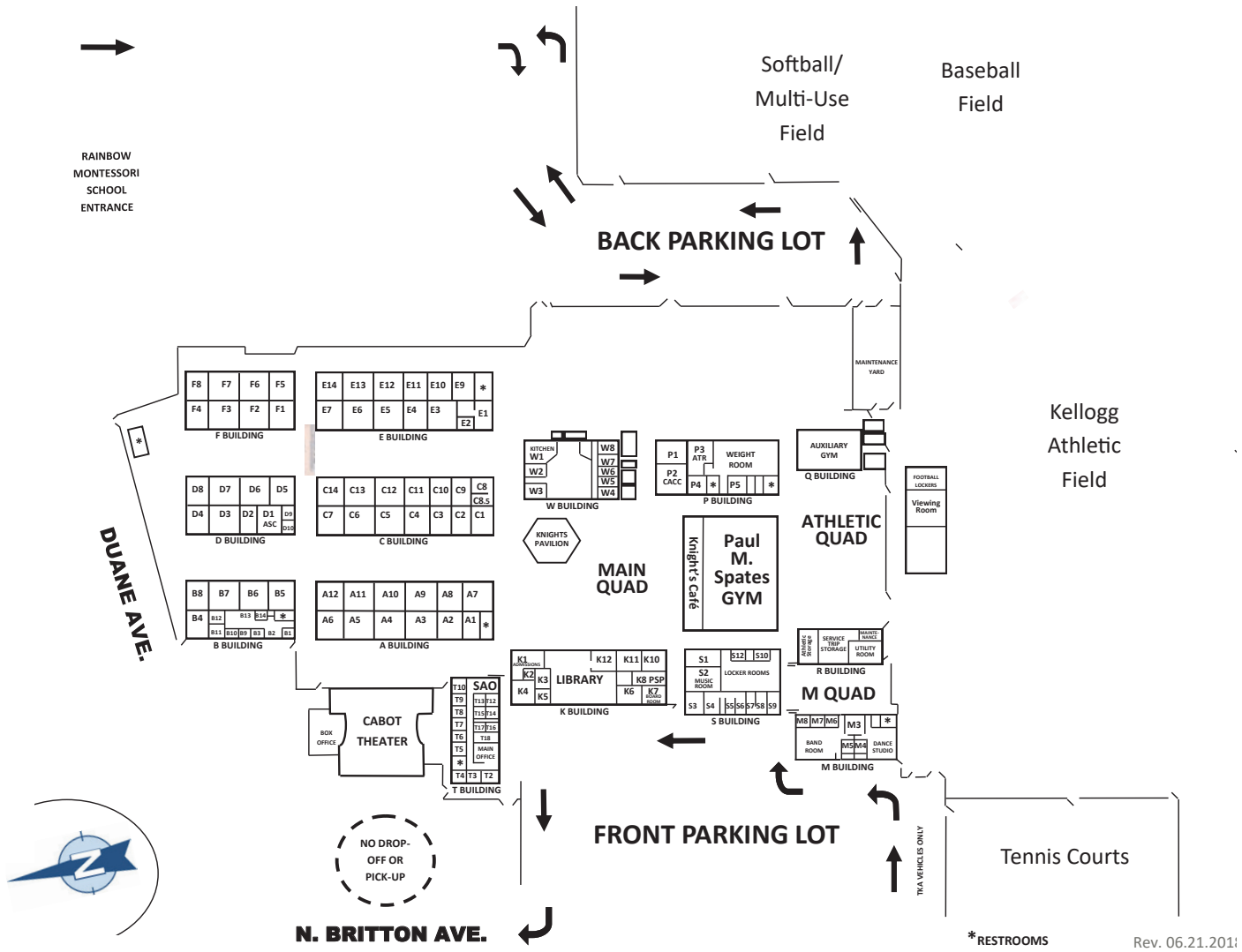
